■ Unemployment – distribution – aggregate demand

- Unemployment decreases the fall back position of labour
- ... and increases functional and personal inequality
- Lack of demand in wage led economies such as the Euroarea (Bhaduri, Marglin 1990, Stockhammer, Onaran 2012, Onaran 2016)
- Studies on effects of rising inequality in personal income distribution on demand less common


Inequality and consumption


Total investment in relation to GDP

Public investment in relation to GDP




■ Unemployment – aggregate demand – labour supply

- Improve bargaining position of labour
- Increase effective demand by public investment and distribution
- Public sector as employer of last resort
(Minsky 1986, Wray 1997ff, Auerback 2014)
- Labour supply as major determinant of the unemployment rate

Germany, Austria 2008 = 100



Germany, Austria



Labour supply

- In search of (progressive) ways of regulating labour supply
- Reduction of working time
- New efforts in Austria
 - „leisure time option“ in collective agreements since 2013 in manufacturing
 - Claim for 6th week of holidays (over 25 years)
